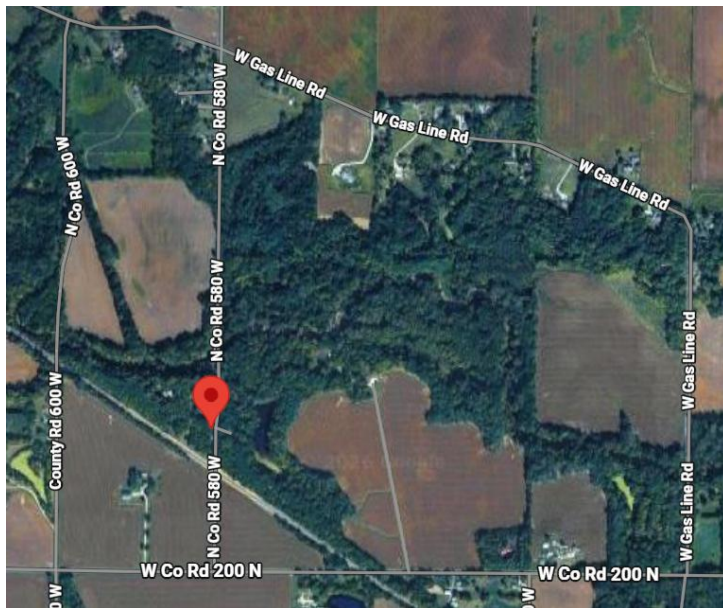
You need not RSVP to attend!
